
About Mountainside


The Design Guidelines

Carefully considered

The overarching vision for Mountainside is contemporary architecture that positively responds to the site's Australian alpine environment.

Mountainside's topography provides an exciting opportunity to design a home that responds to and embraces the landscape, with natural slope, rocky outcrops, existing vegetation and lake and mountain views, while also taking into consideration the micro-climate, water quality and privacy. Each dwelling should enhance rather than dominate or compete with the natural environment.

The design guidelines also cover the design and submission process, development control plans (DCP) and council provisions, and compliance and bond completion. These provisions provide reassurance that your investment and your vision are well managed.



The design guidelines prevent inappropriate development and enhance property value.

The site's designers and architects have recommended appropriate materials and colours for a cohesive neighbourhood, but owners are encouraged to be innovative within those guidelines. Think stepped or tiered rock retaining walls and planting beds to break up the visual impact; high-quality and recycled or local materials for character and individuality; and well-defined street-front entries.

The movement network

Mountainside has been designed in response to the site's natural topography and will be developed with an integrated off-road movement network that makes getting around as simple as possible, while also being functional, safe and enjoyable. The strategy involves a designated shared path connecting to the lake shore and Barry Way, footpaths on access streets, and cycle and walking tracks that weave through the open spaces.

About Jindabyne

It may be known as “the adventure base camp for the Snowy Mountains”, but Jindabyne is so much more than a mecca for action-sport enthusiasts and adrenaline junkies. The postcard-perfect country town, with its expansive lake, is a place of constant reinvention, and has been at the forefront of major change throughout its history.

A five-hour drive from Sydney’s CBD and two hours from Canberra or the Sapphire Coast, Jindabyne thrives in winter with snow enthusiasts flocking to the town for long weekends or weeks on the slopes. It also has plenty to offer in the warmer months, with its rugged mountainside terrain perfect for hikes and mountain biking, and the lake primed for fishing and boating. Even those who would rather not break a sweat on holiday love it here, with plenty of quaint cafes, wineries (or, rather, schnapperies) and shops to explore, and a vibrant and welcoming community to enjoy.

Jindabyne's prosperity

Jindabyne has been going through yet another process of rejuvenation lately, with recent upgrades to essential services making it even more liveable and inviting. These include a new central school and upgrades to the grammar school, a new police station, a new ambulance site, a new skatepark, and a new library.

The Snowy Monaro Regional Economic Development Strategy (REDS) has recognised Jindabyne as the fastest-growing centre in the region. Its population has increased by 12 percent compared to 2001 levels, and unemployment rates have dropped to as low as 2.1 percent.

Australia's high country

In the southeastern corner of New South Wales is a landscape unlike any other. The Snowy Mountains — aka “The Snowies” — region encompasses the mainland’s tallest mountain, Mount Kosciuszko, and the state’s most famous ski fields: Perisher and Thredbo. Even in summer, Thredbo village is vibrant and humming with activity.

Perhaps you can still recite passages of Banjo Paterson’s famous poem “The Man From Snowy River” after learning it in school. When it was published in 1895, the poem cemented the Snowy Mountains in the country’s cultural consciousness and had a major influence on how people thought about high-country stockmen. The poem was also the basis for several films, a television series and even a stage play, all highlighting and celebrating the stunning region.

While Kosciuszko National Park makes up much of this region, it’s not all rugged terrain and adventure sports. There are plenty of breweries, wineries and distilleries, mountainside yoga classes, and Lake Crackenback Resort and Spa provides a stunning opportunity for some R&R.

Summer

This is the time to hit the lakes and crystal-clear streams for picnicking, swimming, canoeing, water skiing and wakeboarding, and fly fishing.



Autumn

As the weather cools, take the opportunity to grab that mountain bike and head out on the trails. Quench that well-earned thirst at one of the region's historic pubs or boutique wineries.



Winter

This is what The Snowies are famous for. Hit the slopes with a snowboard or skis, or simply enjoy après in Thredbo village while the kids snow play.

The region comes alive with colourful flora. It's a fantastic time to explore the park, with the weather being mild and the landscape coming alive after the winter snow has melted.




